






# **MHC Hospitalization Trends**

## **Goals and Vaccine Timeline**

- The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has set an initial operational goal of vaccinating 70% of people age 16 years of age and older, or about 5.6 million people, for COVID-19 by the end of 2021.
- Michigan has prioritized vaccine allocation within CDC's Phases, with an emphasis on both protecting people at increased risk for severe COVID-19 illness and ensuring the continuing functioning of the health care system and essential services in the community.
- Munson Healthcare is working closely with our regional health departments and expanding offering the COVID-19 vaccine to the next priority groups (Tier 1b), which include high-risk adults.



# **Vaccine Clinics Open Across Munson Healthcare (MHC)**

- Clinics opened on 1/12 to MHC patients
- Announced clinics open to all age 90+ community members on 1/15
- Traverse City clinics on 1/19, 1/20, 1/21 (drive-through)
- Cadillac clinic on 1/21 (drive-through)
- Manistee clinic on 1/22 (drive-through)
- Grayling, Otsego and Charlevoix clinics on 1/23 (drive-through)
- Kalkaska clinics expected to open soon
- We have a goal of 3,024 doses this week at the drive-through clinics mentioned above.

MHC is currently vaccinating age 82 and up (and their eligible caregivers)



# **Vaccine Clinics Open Across Munson Healthcare**

- As of January 18, Munson Healthcare has administered 12,191 total vaccines.
- We also continue to hold on-site clinics for employees, volunteers, contractors, and frontline healthcare workers.

## **Community Vaccine Update**

- Munson Healthcare's COVID-19 community vaccination efforts now include all individuals aged 82 and older who reside within our service area.
- The Munson Healthcare service area includes the following counties: Antrim, Benzie, Charlevoix, Clare, Crawford, Emmet, Gladwin, Grand Traverse, Lake, Leelanau, Manistee, Mason, Mecosta, Missaukee, Montmorency, Ogemaw, Osceola, Oscoda, Otsego, Roscommon, and Wexford.
- Any individual aged 65-81 who shares a household with a person aged 82 or older within the Munson Healthcare Service Area is also eligible to receive a vaccine.

# Even With a Vaccine, We Can't Let Our Guard Down ACT (Avoid COVID-19 Today)

Vaccines are only one tool we have in our toolbox. Until we have 70% of the population vaccinated, we still need to be cautious.



Keep your distance (6 or more feet) from people outside your immediate household




Wear your mask when you go out



Wash your hands frequently (or use hand sanitizer with 60% or more alcohol)



## **How Do We Get There?**



10-14 days after second dose = immunity

10-12 months to vaccinate state/region

70% vaccinated to reach herd immunity
