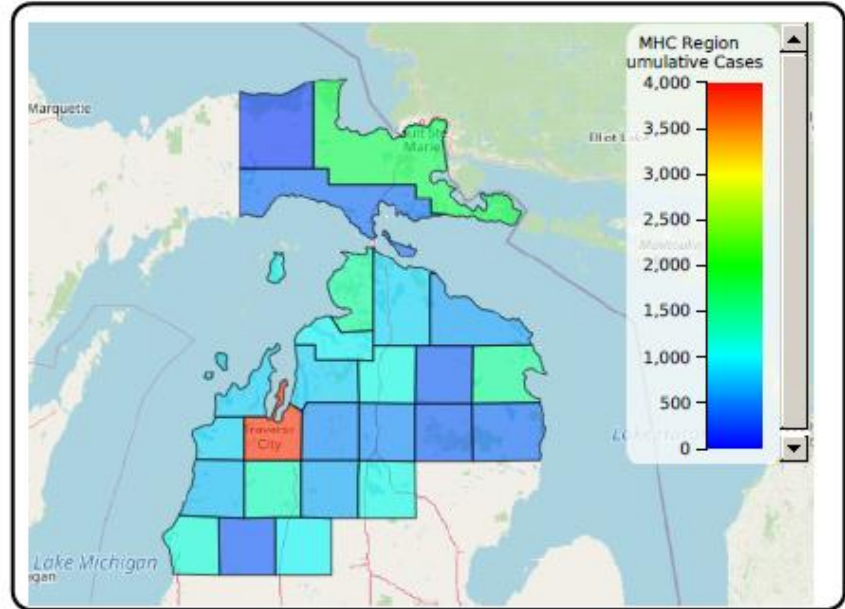

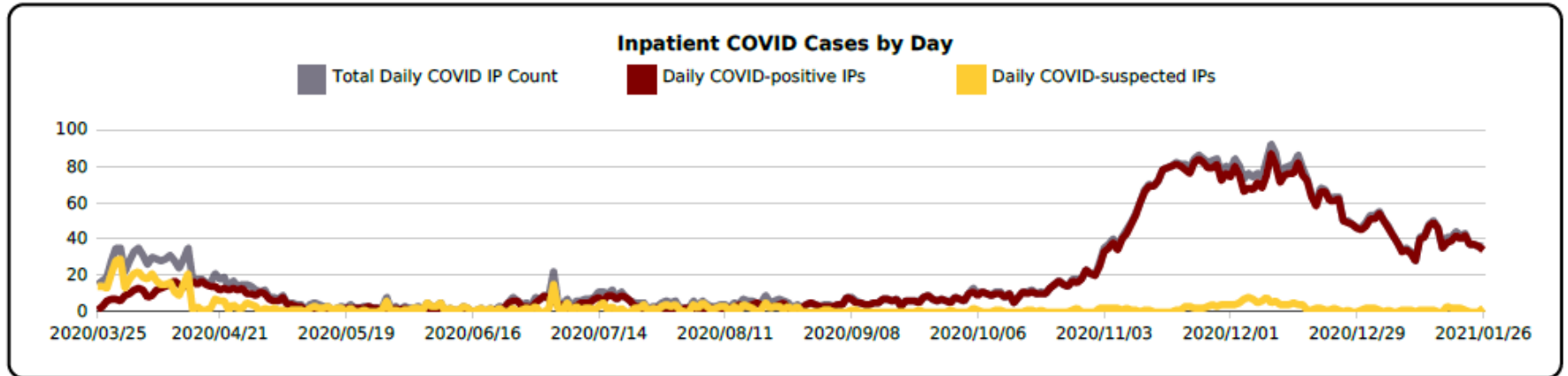

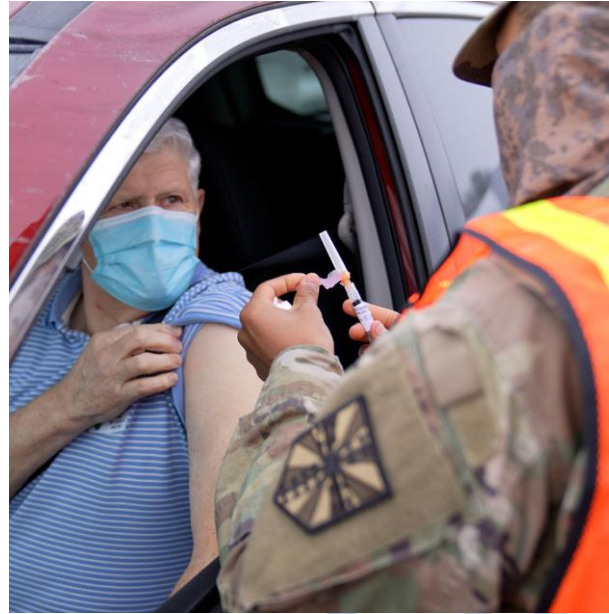
MHC Community Vaccine Clinics Open

- 1/12 Clinics opened to MHC patients 90+
- 1/15 Expanded criteria to patients & community members age 86+
- 1/19 Expanded criteria to 82+
- 1/25 Expanded criteria to 80+
- MHC clinics now open:
 - Cadillac
 - Charlevoix
 - Grayling
 - Kalkaska
 - Manistee
 - Otsego
 - Traverse City



Vaccine Clinics Open Across Munson Healthcare

- As of January 25, MHC has administered more than **16,757** doses.
- Over 60% of MHC Healthcare workers now vaccinated. (62.9%)



Munson Healthcare Scheduling Process

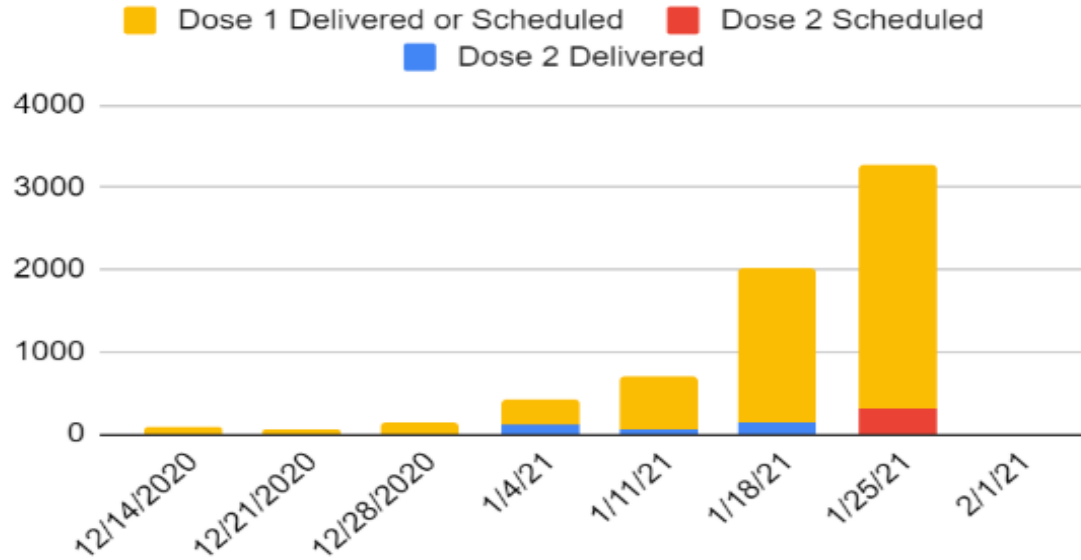

- **Focus of Distribution Plan**

- Clinic at NMC's Hagerty Center began last week; 2,150 vaccines
- This week, 3,200 first and second doses
- We have the expanded location, the staff, but the vaccine supply is limited.

- **Focus of Distribution Plan**
 - Continue/complete Healthcare Workers in 1A first priority – 1st and 2nd doses
 - Schedule mid- and large-scale clinics for 1B: First Responders, >65, and school staff
 - Continue/complete AFC/LTC facility residents and staff
- **What we want our jurisdiction to know:**
 - Advocate for additional supplies as demand exceeds vaccination supply
 - Visit the website to complete online form to get in scheduling queue
 - Businesses fill out 1 form for employee population
 - AAANM/UW Senior Hotline to assist those with barriers to internet – 231-715-5557
 - Patience needed!

- Due to vaccine limitations, continues to prioritize Phase 1A and some of Phase 1B including persons 65+, first responders, jails/corrections staff, and school staff.
- There are three waitlist registration links on our website
 - Seniors 65+
 - Phase 1A Healthcare Workers
 - Phase 1B Priority Frontline Workers
- Beginning to plan for Phase 1C – will have interest survey link posted soon
- DHD#10 vaccinated 1,709 individuals last week; running total since 12/22/2020 is 11,944
- Clinics are by appointment only - no walk-ins

Vaccine Allocation

- Each FQHC, Health Department, Hospital, Primary Care Office, Pharmacy (CVS and Walgreens), etc. are receiving vaccine allocation separately at different times.
- Counts and requests are based on the number of employees, patients, and residents.
- Allocations continue to remain uncertain.
- Our collective goal is fair and equitable distribution.
- There is no centralized process, so it will look different in each county.
