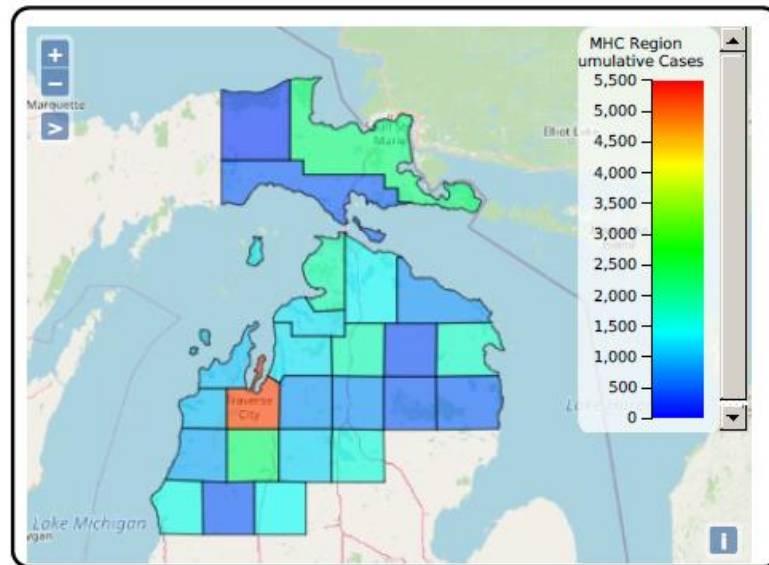

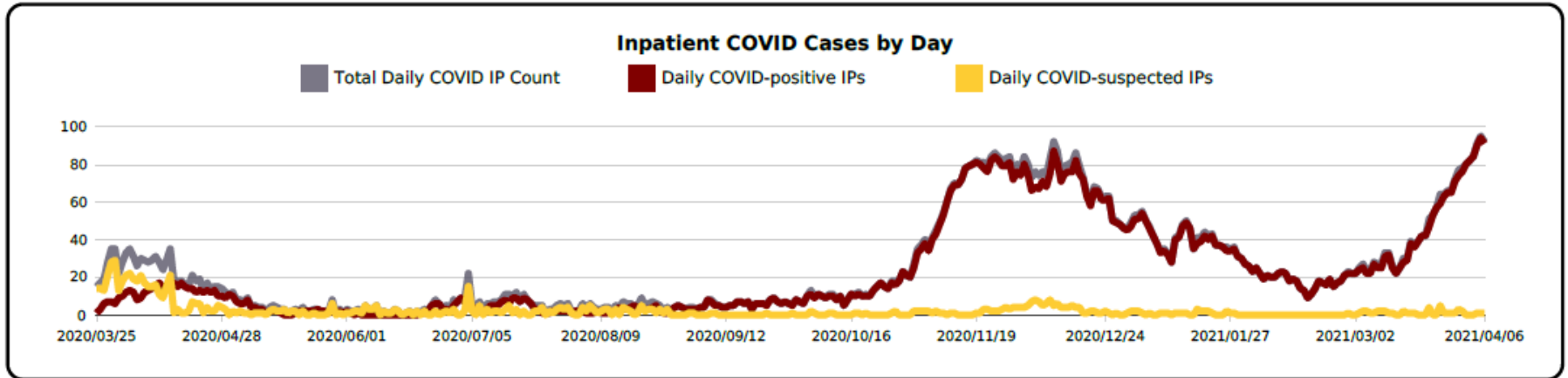

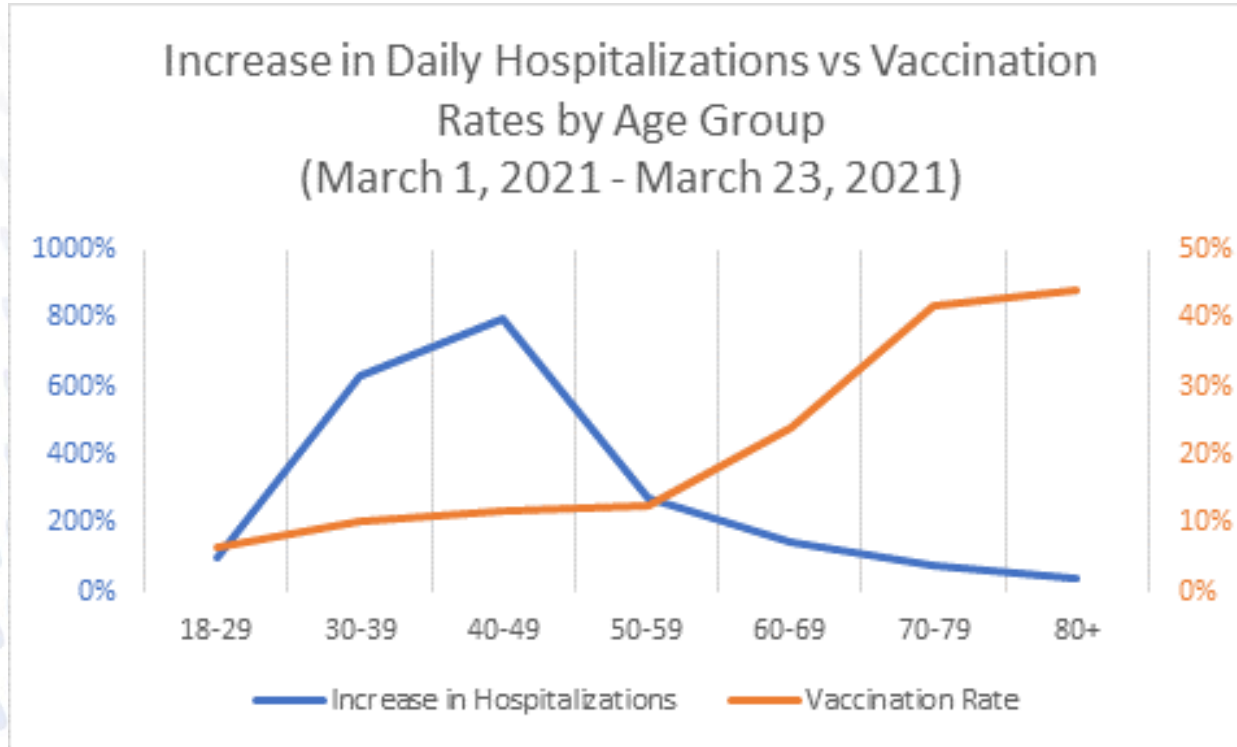

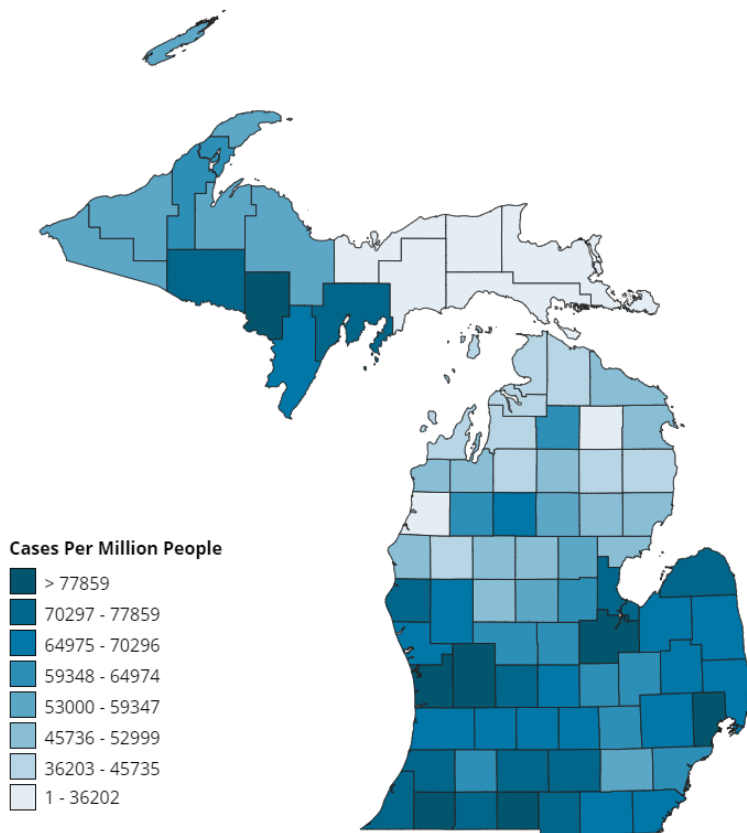


Hospitalization Trends: Age and Benefit of Vaccine

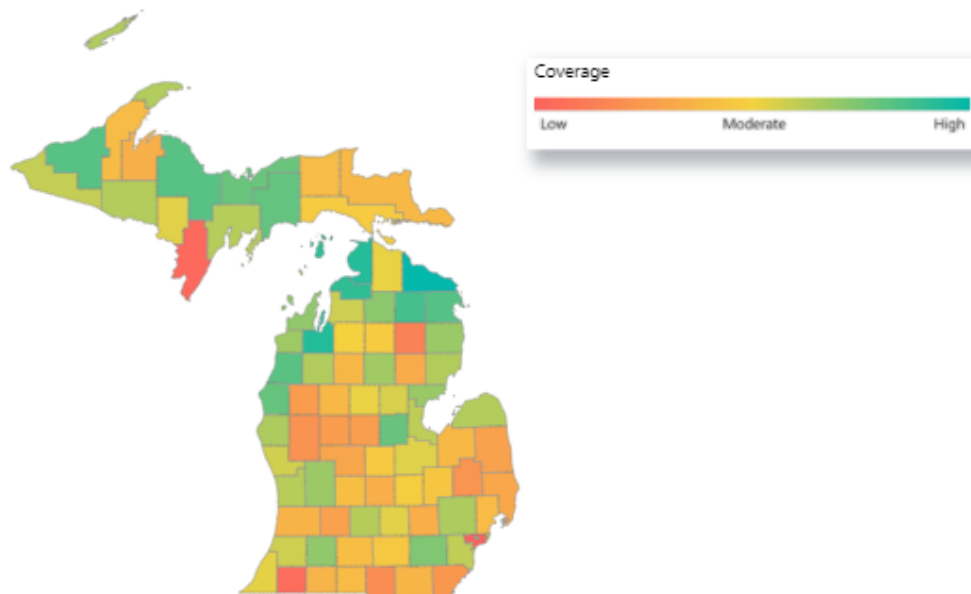

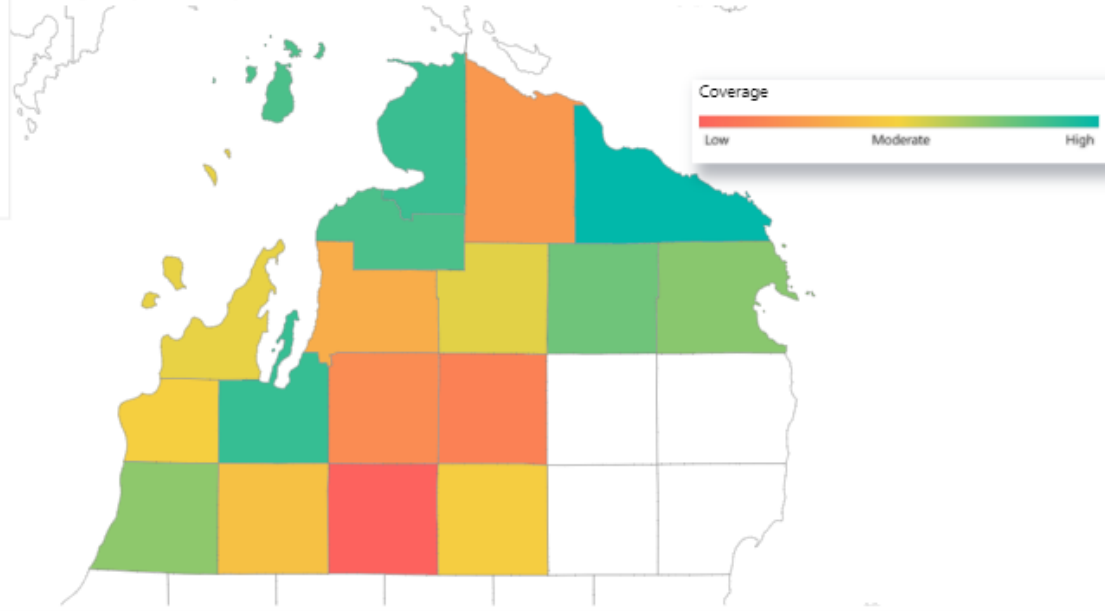

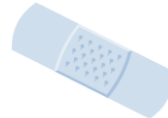

Michigan's estimated schedule for first doses administered as of March 12, 021 (MDHHS)

As of April 5, 2021, all areas of the state may, as vaccine supplies are available, implement vaccination of all people aged 16 and up who were not previously eligible.

COVID-19 and Quarantine

If I am exposed to the virus, how long do I have to quarantine?

- People who have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 must quarantine and monitor themselves for symptoms for 14 days following exposure. If you show any symptoms of the virus, you should immediately isolate and get tested.
- Due to increasing case rates and variant spread in Michigan, MDHHS has reinstated a standard 14-day quarantine for close contacts of COVID-19 cases. This will remove the option of reducing quarantine to 10 days, effective April 5, 2020.

Quarantine instructions for people who are fully vaccinated:

- Fully vaccinated persons who meet criteria are no longer be required to quarantine following an exposure to someone with COVID-19. Individuals should keep their COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card to confirm their exemption from quarantine. **Federal Government allocating vaccine to retail pharmacies.**

Grand Traverse County Updates

● Metrics Rising In GT County

- 7-day average - 39 cases per day - average was 27 in November 2020 when case prioritization was initiated
- 20% of cases in March were 0-19 population; 43 school age cases in the last week
- 76% of cases in last 30 days in those under 50 years of age
- Percent positivity rose from 3.6% to 11.4% over the last month (similar to November 2020 rise)
- Four cases of B.1.1.7 variant reported last 2 weeks
- Get tested! It's easily accessible!

Vaccination Distribution

Grand Traverse County Health Department Vaccinations:

- This week GTCHD will administer 1203 first doses and 1982 2nd doses (3185 total doses)
- The cumulative number of vaccine doses administered during GTCHD vaccine clinics through April 5th are:
 - 17,443 - Initiated; 13,657 - Completed
 - 31,100 Total Doses

 - Don't wait to isolate or quarantine
 - Contact tracers very busy so may not call for a while
- Total vaccines administered as of April 5: **68,195**
- Vaccine clinics
 - This week – 2nd dose clinics
 - Next week – 1st dose clinics Wed & Fri; 2nd dose clinic Sat
- Working on vaccinating special populations with Johnson & Johnson – homebound, jails, shelters, etc.
