Pediatric Cases in Michigan and Our Region

- The state is reporting a sharp uptick in pediatric cases, and as a result a sharp uptick in pediatric hospitalizations.
- Although those numbers are still low, in conjunction with cases of RSV and expected flu, there is concern.
- The overall percentage of patients contracting COVID-19 is increasing for those 0-18 years of age.
 - Example: District Health Department #10 has increased from 1.7% positivity rate in early July to 14.3% in late September.



Masking Recommendations for School Age Children




- The American Academy of Pediatrics, CDC and MDHHS all strongly recommend masking is school settings.
- Masking protects both you and those around you.
- Since COVID-19 has a high viral load it is very transmissible.
- Please consider masking both you and your children in school settings and other indoor settings.
- Masking will also help prevent the spread of flu and RSV, both which we are already seeing in Michigan.

Why Get Tested If You Are Experiencing COVID-19 Symptoms?

- Protect others around you by preventing the spread of the virus.
- Monoclonal Antibody Therapy must be completed within the first 10 days of the onset of symptoms.
 - COVID-19 has a 2.2% mortality rate and it 20 times more lethal than Influenza.




Booster vs. 3rd Dose



- Testing is drive-up and is done in the parking lot behind the main building, under the carports
- Location: 2600 LaFranier Rd. Traverse City, MI, 49686
- Hours vary week to week depending on staffing check social media and
 <u>www.gtcountymi.gov/2211</u> for current schedule and link to appointments
- Results are delivered electronically (email/text) within two hours
- **PCR Tests are taking up to 72 hours to return results**
- This is diagnostic testing for those with symptoms or exposed, not travel testing

- Vaccination rates
 - 67.1% of HDNW residents 16+ with a first dose
 - 38.2% of 12-15 with a first dose
 - 75.8% of BLDHD residents 16+ with a first dose
 - 53.0% of 12-15 with a first dose
- Cases increasing across both health department jurisdictions
 - Average daily cases reported:
 - HDNW: 41 cases
 - BLDHD: 12 cases

- Case trends:
 - Cases increasing (33.6%): September 11-September 17= 614 cases; September 18-September 24= 820 cases
 - Daily cases per million increasing: September 9= 245.6; September 16= 308.1
 - Percent positivity increasing: September 9= 13.7%; September 16 = 14.3%
- Total vaccines administered by DHD#10: **106,456** as of 9/21/21
- Numerous pop-up clinics scheduled go to <u>www.dhd10.org/events</u>
- Walk-ins welcome during the week, encourage calling ahead or coming during normal clinic dates and times vary for each county, check website for more info
