AVERAGE DAILY CASES PER 100,000 PEOPLE IN PAST WEEK


















Michigan Remains a Hot Spot





Of the total number of patients hospitalized for COVID-19, this represents how many are in an ICU and their vaccination status.





Case Rate Trends by Age Group

Daily new confirmed and probable cases per million by age group (7-day rolling average)



- Case rate trends for most age groups were impacted by reporting over Thanksgiving holiday but are increasing again
- Case rates by onset date for all age groups are between 315 and 722 cases per million (through 11/29)
- Case counts and case rates are highest for 30-39-year-olds this week

Omicron: What We Know About It

- Omicron has been found in Michigan but has not been reported in our region.
- Testing is limited so it is most likely in our region.
- CDC expects that anyone with Omicron infection can spread the virus to others, even if they are vaccinated or don't have symptoms.
- Current vaccines are expected to protect against severe illness, hospitalizations, and deaths due to infection with the Omicron variant.







Grand Traverse County COVID-19 Case Numbers and Trends:

- Grand Traverse County remains at a high transmission rate with the weekly case rates slightly decreasing for the last week
 - 338 newly identified cases and 6 deaths in last 7 days
 - Average of 48 cases per day
 - The current regional percent positivity: 16.2%
 - Grand Traverse County percent positivity: 15.8%
 - Cumulative Total Cases: 11,555

Cumulative Total Deaths: 161


- Statewide and Countywide, deaths have been increasing for three weeks and are at the highest levels we have seen throughout the pandemic
- This is the largest and most serious COVID surge we have experienced in Northern Michigan

Benzie-Leelanau District Health Department and Health Department of Northwest Michigan

- Clinics for 5-11 year-olds and 12 years and older
 - Appointments readily available, listed on health department websites
 - Clinics separate for younger clients: smaller and geared toward young children
 - Parent/guardian must accompany minor for vaccination
 - Booster available for anyone 16 and older
- Testing clinics available throughout communities
 - HDNW testing available Mondays at E-Free Church (Gaylord), Thursdays at the Central Lake
 Fire Department and Saturdays at the Charlevoix County Shirley Roloff Center
 - BLDHD testing available Mondays and Thursdays at the VFW Post 7731 (Lake Leelanau), and Tuesdays and Fridays at the Crystal Café (Benzonia)
- What we want our jurisdiction to know
 - Protective measures such as masking work while we work on getting more people vaccinated
 - Demand for vaccination has increased with boosters and newly eligible children



District Health Department #10 COVID-19 Case Trends

Jennifer Morse, Medical Director

- Cases decreasing (-8.7%): November 27-December 3 = 1254 cases December 4-December 10 = 1145 cases
- Daily cases per million increasing: November 26= 530.7; December 1= 602.1
- Percent positivity **slightly decreasing**: November 26= **20.7%**; December 1 = **20.5%**

Current Testing Results

- Big Rapids thru 12/10
 - 1106 individuals tested
 - 275 (24.9%) positive
- Cadillac thru 12/10
 - 106 individuals tested
 - 21 (19.8%) positive
- Kalkaska thru 12/9
 - 2100 individuals tested
 - 586 (28.1%) positive
- Newaygo/NCRESA
 - 2219 individuals tested
 - 630 (28.6%) positive



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District Health Department #10 COVID-19 Vaccination Trends

- 58.0% of DHD#10 residents have initiated vaccination
- 52.9% of DHD#10 residents have completed vaccination series
- Map shows vaccination rates among 16+ age group by zip code
 - Darker pink = lower vaccination rate
 - Darker green = higher vaccination rate

- Vaccination for **5–11-year-olds** began in early November at our clinics and by appointment: 10.0% of DHD#10 residents aged 5-11 years have initiated vaccination
 - Parents can schedule appointments for children at <u>www.dhd10.org/schedule</u>
 - Parent/Guardian must be present for vaccinating minors
 - COVID-19 vaccine widely available locally, and parents/guardians should go wherever works best for their family


